

# Leonard Woodrow McDonald, T-36

17 May 1917 – 9 December 1944

(aged 27)



*Staff Sergeant Leonard W. McDonald, aged 27, son of Mr. and Mrs. B. McDonald of 2544 Princeton, was killed in action on the European front December 9, 1944, according to a War Department notice to his parents.*

*In addition to his parents, he leaves his wife, Mrs. Goldie Jones McDonald, formerly of Heber Springs AR, but now living at Shreveport LA; a year-old-son, Richard Glenn McDonald; three sisters, Mrs. Dorothy May Parkey, of Orchi St., Mrs. John Knight, 788 South Cox; Barbara Jean McDonald, 2544 Princeton and a brother, William Earl McDonald of the same address.*

*Sergeant McDonald was engineer-gunner on a B-26 bomber, and had been overseas since June. He was a graduate of Tech High School. He entered service February 17, 1942, and trained at Keesler Field, Biloxi MS. He was a member of Parkview Presbyterian Church, and was active in Presbyterian young people's work.*
