Slaying statements conflict, police say

Police yesterday sorted through conflicting statements they said were given by a suspect in the slaying of Floyd Eugene McNary, 30, of 165 Bickford, Apt. 7.

"We have a number of discrepancies in his story," Lt. Jerry Bursi of the violent crimes squad said. The suspect had not been charged last night.

McNary was shot once in the chest about 11:30 Friday night at the suspect's home in the 100 block of Mill near Second, police said.

McNary was an employee of A. S. Body Shop. R. S. Lewis and Sons Funeral Home has charge.

He leaves his mother, Mrs. Josephine McNary, and two sisters, Mrs. Sandra Jones and Miss Linda Faye McNary, all of Memphis, and three brothers, Kenneth McNary of Seaside, Calif., Anthony McNary of Knoxville and Calvin McNary of Memphis.
