Second Lieutenant Billy F. Moss, bombardier on a Liberator of the Fifteenth Air Force, has been missing in action since October 7, when he went on a bombing mission over Vienna.

A native Memphian, Lt. Moss is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles C. Moss, of Memphis, and husband of the former Jeanette Sterrett, who now lives in Tucson AZ.

He is a graduate of Tech High and was within a half-year of completing degree requirements at Memphis State when he entered the Army. He won his wings and commission in June 1943 at Big Springs TX and stationed in southern Italy.

His commanding officer wrote his parents that Lt. Moss' ship was forced to drop out of the formation because of damage received from Flak. As it

was last seen at a high altitude and apparently under good control, we hope that the crew was able to make a successful landing. Information from The Press-Scimitar, Wednesday, November 8, 1944.
