

John Wardlaw McGoldrick, T-36

14 September 1917 – 29 April 1992

(aged 74)



*First Lieutenant John W. McGoldrick, son of Mrs. A. R. McGoldrick, 365 North Bellevue, has been awarded the Air Medal and an Oak Leaf Cluster while serving as a Flying Fortress pilot. Lieutenant McGoldrick completed his pilot training at Blytheville AR, in February 1944. A graduate of the University of Memphis Law School, class of 39, he was formerly an attorney for the U.S. Department of Internal Revenue of Memphis. McGoldrick, 27, not only has been promoted to Captain, but he has completed his tour of duty and is expected home on leave soon. He is a B-17 pilot with an Eighth Air Force base in England.*

*Son of Mrs. A. R. McGoldrick, 365 N. Bellevue, he was an attorney for the Internal Revenue Department in Memphis before he enlisted in the AAF in 1943.*

*Captain McGoldrick graduated from Memphis Tech High School, Memphis University Law School and began a member of the Memphis and Shelby County Bar Association.*

*A brother, Sergeant Arthur Roy McGoldrick, Jr., also a Memphis Tech High graduate, recently returned from India where he served as a radio mechanic with the ATC. He is stationed at Courtland Army Airfield AL.*
