

Patricia Lynn Sitton – Class of 1968



Fulton Police Chief Milford Jobe said today (11 January 1975) that County Coroner Harold Everette has ruled as murder-suicide the shooting deaths of Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Dwain Ingram here yesterday. Chief Jobe said the couple had been separated several weeks and that Ingram, who has been living at Water Valley KY, pulled up in front of Patricia Sitton Ingram's home in a car.

Mrs. Ingram had backed out into the street apparently to go to work at Pat's Beauty Shop, which she operated, according to Chief Jobe, when Ingram stepped from his car and shot her twice with a .22 caliber pistol. Ingram then shot himself in the chest, Jobe said. He was 26 and she was 24. He was employed at a Wickliffe KY paper mill. They had a son, Michell Shane Ingram, age 1. Mrs. Ingram, a former Memphian also leaves her mother, Mrs. Irene Chandler Goff, 740 Loeb in Memphis, and her father, Joseph Sitton; a brother and a sister, Joseph Sitton, Jr. and Mrs. Janet Boyette, both of Memphis.
