MEMPHIAN MISSING IN RAID OVER REICH



Lieutenant William C. Stewart, Jr., Fortress bombardier with the AAF in England has been missing since action over Germany, September 12, the War Department has notified his parents, of 853 N. Avalon.

The 20-year-old flier is a Tech High graduate and communicant of Little Flower Catholic Church. Before joining the AAF in January 1943, he was in business with his father at Stewart Coffee Company.

Lieutenant William C. Stewart, Jr., missing over Germany since September 12, has been reported killed in action on that date. He would have been 21 on September 20.

His parents, Mr. and Mrs. Stewart, his three brothers, Vance, Tommy and Jack, and his sister, Jean, all live at 853 N. Avalon.

A Tech High graduate, Lieutenant Stewart was associated with Stewart Coffee Company when he entered the Army in January 1943. He won his

wings as a bombardier in December 1943 at Carlsbad NM and went overseas in June. The Air Medal will be posthumously.
